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## The Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE)

### *Overview of 2021 Survey Results*

### *Oklahoma State University Institute of Technology*

#### **Introduction**

The Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE), a product and service of the Center for Community College Student Engagement (the “Center”), provides information about effective educational practice in community colleges. The Center’s goal is to provide member colleges with results that can be used to inform decision making and target institutional improvements. *Student engagement*, or the amount of time and energy students invest in meaningful educational practices, is the underlying foundation for the Center’s work. The CCSSE survey instrument is designed to capture student engagement as a measure of institutional quality.

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#### **CCSSE Member Colleges**

The 2021 CCSSE Cohort includes 411 institutions from 46 states, Bermuda, Marshall Islands, and Micronesia. CCSSE uses a cohort of participating colleges in all core survey analyses. The current cohort consists of the colleges that participated in CCSSE 2019, 2020 and 2021. If a college participated multiple times across 2019, 2020, and 2021, only their most recent data are included in cohort calculations. Please note: Due to COVID-19, only 23 colleges were able to complete the administration of CCSSE 2020.

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#### **CCSSE Administration: Online**

To boost responses to the online survey, CCSSE does not employ a sampling strategy for the online administration. The online survey invitation is sent to all students who are enrolled in any credit bearing or developmental education courses offered by the institution during the spring academic term. Certain course types are not eligible for inclusion in the online CCSSE administration; these include non-credit, dual enrollment, most ESL courses, individual instruction, and individual study or self-paced classes.

Of those students sent the online survey invitation at OSUIT, 330 respondents completed the online survey. The number of completed surveys produced an overall “percent of target” rate of 18.9%. The percent of target rate is the ratio of the adjusted number of completed surveys (surveys that were filled out properly and did not fall into any of the exclusionary categories) to the number of access codes OSUIT received for the online survey.

### **Excluded Respondents**

Excluding certain respondents from institutional and cohort-level reports ensures that results are comparable across institutions. Respondents are excluded from institutional reports for the following reasons:

- The respondent did not indicate whether they were enrolled full-time or part-time at the institution.
  - The survey is invalid. A survey is invalid if a student does not answer any of the 19 sub-items in item 4, answers *very often* to all 19 sub-items, or answers *never* to all 19 sub-items.
  - The student reported their age as under 18.
  - The student indicated that they have taken the survey in a previous class or did not respond to item 3.
  - Oversample respondents are not included because they are selected outside of CCSSE’s primary sampling procedures.
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### **2021 Student Respondent Profile**

Please note that percentages may not total 100% in each category due to missing data and/or rounding.

#### **Enrollment Status**

Of all surveyed students in the CCSSE 2021 cohort, 60.0% report part-time enrollment status. The inverse representation of part-time and full-time students in the CCSSE respondent and actual student populations is the result of random sampling and the in-class administration process. For this reason, survey results are either weighted or disaggregated on the full-time/part-time variable so that reports will accurately reflect the underlying student population. Population data<sup>1</sup> for OSUIT indicate that 37.0% of students attend OSUIT part-time, but only 25.0% of the OSUIT students who participated in CCSSE were classified as part-time. In comparison, the Small Colleges group is comprised of 56% part-time and 44% full-time students.

#### **Age**

Student respondents at OSUIT range in age from 18 to 65+ years old, with 61.5% between 18 and 24 years old. The Small Colleges and 2021 Cohort groups had fewer students in the traditional age range (18 to 24) with 50% and 53%, respectively.

#### **Gender Identity**

Among OSUIT student respondents, 56.1% identify as a man and 42.7% as a woman, while 1.2% identify as Other or that they prefer not to respond. Among the Small Colleges comparison group, the ratio is 40% male to 60% female, while the 2021 Cohort shows a 41% male to 59% female ratio.

#### **Racial/Ethnic Identification**

Many of our OSUIT student respondents identify with a single racial/ethnic identity: 59.4% White, 3.0% Hispanic or Latino, 3.0% Black or African American, 1.2% Asian, 8.8% American Indian or Alaska Native, and 0.0% Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander; 20.9% marked more than one category when responding to the question, “What is your racial or ethnic identification?” Differences from the comparison groups appear in OSUIT’s higher

percentage of American Indian students which is almost double that of the Small Colleges group, and more than triple that of the 2021 Cohort. Other differences include OSUIT's much lower percentage of Black or African American students (11% for both comparison groups), Hispanic or Latino students (11% for Small Colleges group, 17% for the 2021 Cohort), and white students (59% for Small Colleges, 54% for the 2021 Cohort). OSUIT differs substantially from the comparison groups on students who identify as having two or more races (4% for both comparison groups).

### **International Students**

Only 1.2% of OSUIT students responded *yes* to the question, "Are you an international student or non-resident alien?"; *CCSSE* does not provide data for comparison in this category.

### **First-Generation Status**

Among our OSUIT student respondents, 30.3% indicated that neither parent has attended at least some college; accordingly, these students are considered "first-generation." Breaking this down by parentage, 57.4% of respondents indicate that their mothers have at least some college experience, while 46.8% indicate that their fathers do. *CCSSE* does not provide data for comparison in this category.

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*The results for the following student respondent categories are weighted according to the most recent IPEDS population data.*

### **Non-Native English-Speaking Students**

At OSUIT, 4.2% of *CCSSE* respondents are non-native English speakers. *CCSSE* does not provide data for comparison in this category.

### **College-Sponsored Activities**

A large proportion (77.3%) of OSUIT student respondents do not participate in any college-sponsored activities (including organizations, campus publications, student government, intramural sports, etc.) while 19.3% spend 1 to 5 hours per week participating in these activities. *CCSSE* does not provide data for comparison in this category.

### **Total Credit Hours Earned**

At OSUIT, 36.9% of surveyed students have completed fewer than 15 credit hours; 20.2% have completed 15-29 credit hours; and 42.8% have completed more than 30 credit hours. *CCSSE* does not provide data for comparison in this category.

### **External Commitments**

Among OSUIT respondents, 50.8% work 21 or more hours per week; 33.3% care for dependents more than 10 hours per week; and 15.9% spend more than five hours per week commuting to class. *CCSSE* does not provide data for comparison in this category.

### **Goals**

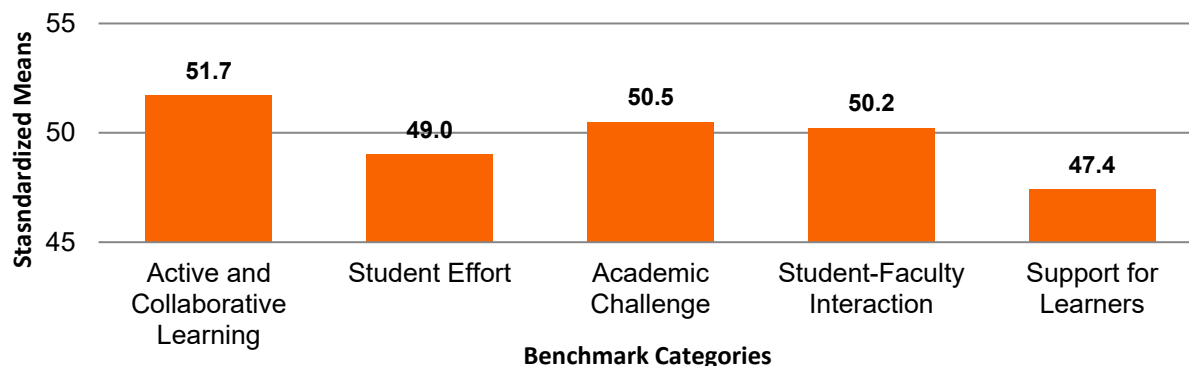
OSUIT students were asked to indicate their reasons or goals for attending this college and could mark multiple goals as applicable: 30.2% identified transferring to a 4-year college or university as a goal, 84.9% identified obtaining an associate degree and 55.4% identified completing a certificate program as a goal, 87.6% indicated that obtaining or updating job-related skills is a goal, and 38.8% a career change as a goal for attending the college. *CCSSE* does not provide data for comparison in this category.

### **CCSSE Benchmarks of Effective Educational Practice**

To assist colleges in their efforts to reach for excellence, the Center reports national benchmarks of effective educational practice in community colleges. Research shows that the more actively engaged students are—with college faculty and staff, with other students, and with the subject matter—the more likely they are to learn and to achieve their academic goals.

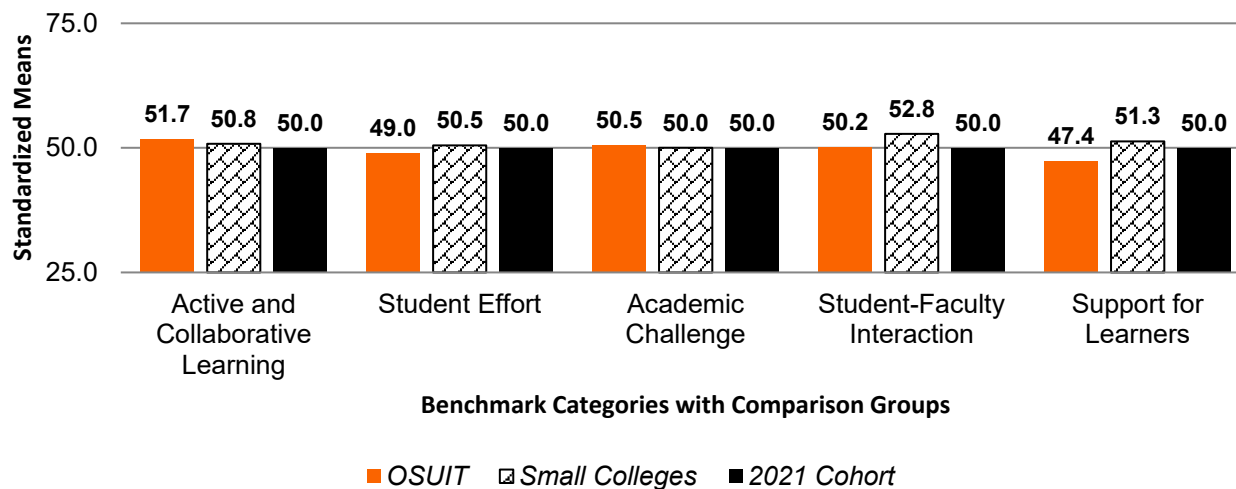
The five benchmarks of effective educational practice in community colleges are: Active and Collaborative Learning, Student Effort, Academic Challenge, Student-Faculty Interaction, and Support for Learners. *CCSSE* benchmarks are groups of conceptually related survey items that focus on institutional practices and student behaviors that promote student engagement and are positively related to student learning and persistence. Standard benchmark scores are used to compare each institution’s performance to that of similar institutions and with the *CCSSE* Cohort. Each individual benchmark score is computed by averaging the scores on survey items that make up that benchmark. Benchmark scores are standardized so that the mean (the average of all participating students) always is 50 and the standard deviation is 25. When reading scores for OSUIT, understand that each compares to a benchmark of 50 for the comparison group of all schools participating during a three-year period, note: If an institution participated more than once in a three-year period, only the most recent data is included in the results for comparison.

When observing the side-by-side comparisons with the Small Colleges group and the 2021 CCSSE cohort, OSUIT performed well compared to the Active and Collaborative Learning and the Academic Challenge benchmarks. OSUIT’s performance regarding Support for Learners and Student Effort fell somewhat short of the benchmarks and suggests we should delve deeper into these outcomes. It is interesting to note the higher performance of schools in the Small Colleges comparison group on the Student-Faculty Interaction and Support for Learners benchmarks. Aside from noting that only 23 colleges participated in the 2020 administration of the CCSSE, it is unclear how the COVID-19 pandemic may have affected the results.

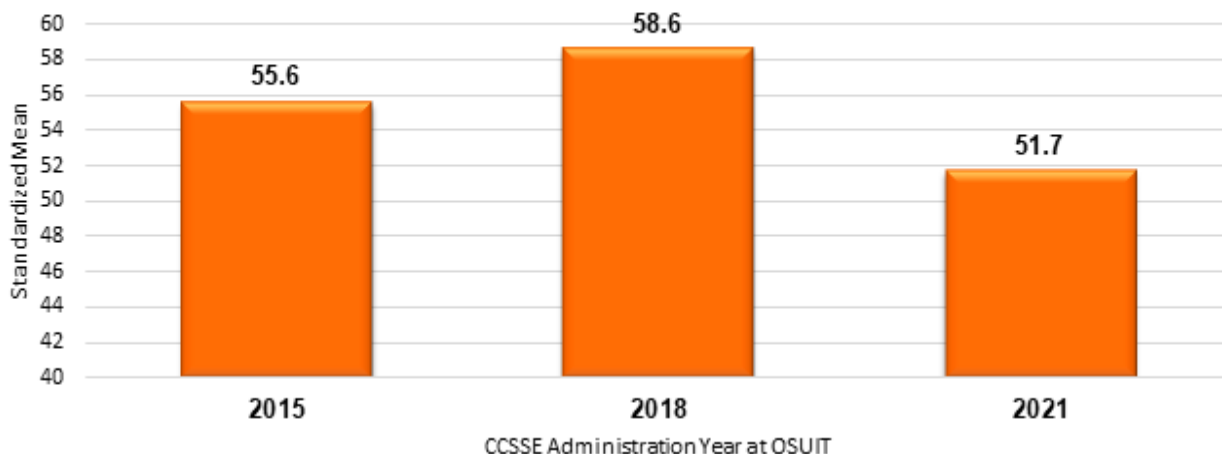
### Benchmarks Over Time

Since OSUIT has participated in multiple CCSSE administrations, following are the benchmark scores from each administration to help identify changes over time. Although these graphs show only OSUIT scores, they are still based on standardized scores with a benchmark mean of 50 and a standard deviation of 25. In 2021, CCSSE was offered to colleges for administration in both the traditional paper form and with the option for online administration. Due to the constraints placed on OSUIT due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we opted to administer the CCSSE online for 2021.

Note that the benchmark responses were generally highest in 2018 when the CCSSE continued to be administered face-to-face in selected classrooms. Remember that, as opposed to previous in-class paper-and-pencil administrations of the CCSSE, the OSUIT sample of participants in 2021 was drawn from all OSUIT students who were qualified to participate and who chose to participate *outside* of class (self-selected), which may have an unexpected effect on the results.

One area the pandemic may be expected to have an impact is in Active and Collaborative Learning. With classrooms emptied and classroom activities primarily moved to an online modality, face-to-face interactions were relegated to the video screen. However, some OSUIT instructors were encouraged to develop creative ways for students to interact with each other in this novel environment; this may be why OSUIT students continue to rate the category above the benchmark. For example, one item, 4g: “Worked with classmates outside of class to prepare class assignments” was rated higher by OSUIT students than either the Small Colleges or 2021 Cohort comparison groups ( $p < .01$ ; see appendix C).

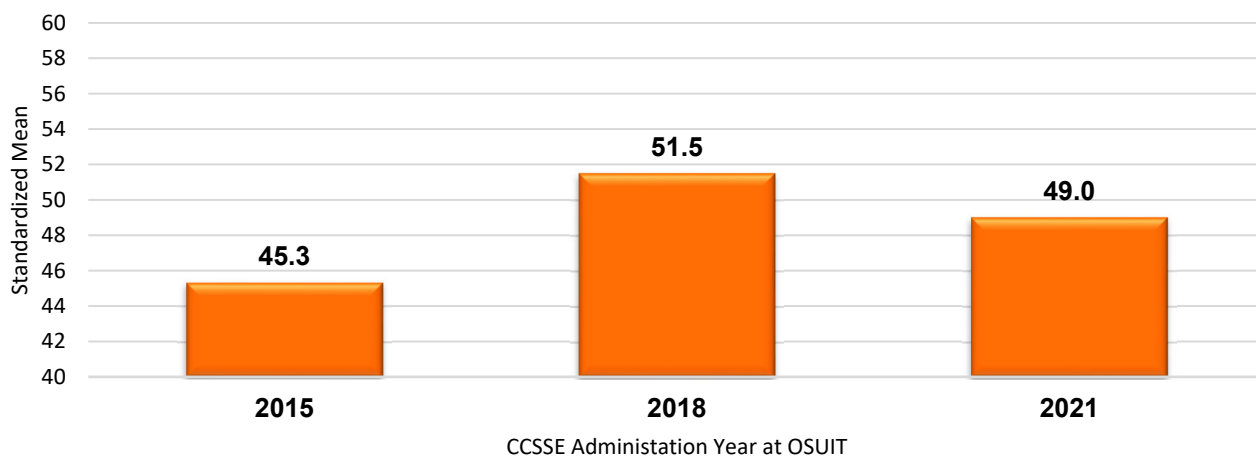
### Active and Collaborative Learning

On the other hand, although Student Effort at OSUIT is still substantially higher than in 2015, it may deserve some attention as OSUIT students rate this group of items below the benchmark. Specifically, OSUIT student responses to item 12.1: “How often have you used the following services during the current academic year?” show that they were less likely to use the computer lab than students in the *small college* comparison group ( $p < .01$ ; see appendix C).

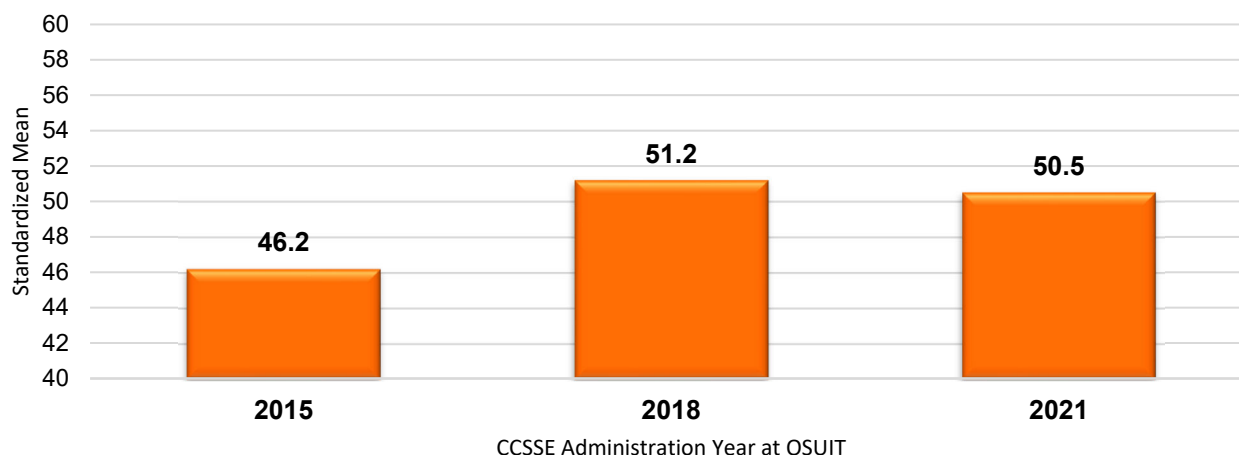
### Student Effort

OSUIT continues above the benchmark on Academic Challenge with only a slight decrease in 2021. Although OSUIT students rated most items in this category slightly higher than students in the comparison groups, none of the differences among the responses reached a level of statistical significance.

## Academic Challenge



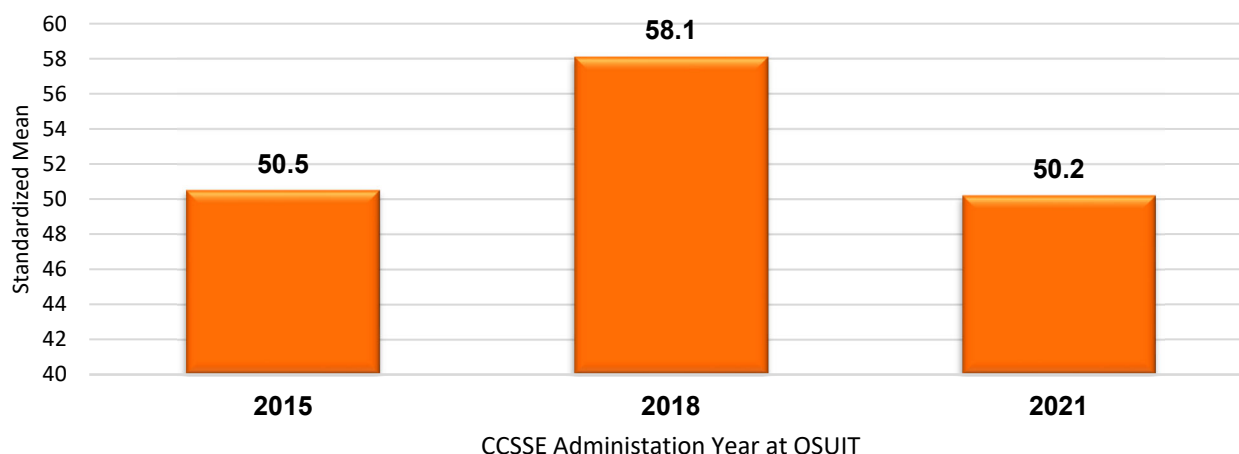

As for Student-Faculty Interaction over time, OSUIT students reported levels of interaction relatively equal to those of the comparison groups in 2015 and 2021 but reported substantially higher levels of Student-Faculty Interaction in 2018. For example, in retrospect, OSUIT students in 2018 more often:

- Talked about career plans with an instructor or advisor
- Discussed ideas from (their) readings of classes with instructors outside of class
- Worked with instructors on activities other than coursework

In 2021, OSUIT students report similar levels of Student-Faculty Interaction as do students in the Small Colleges and 2021 Cohort comparison groups. It is easy to see how the pandemic may have put a damper on interactions between students and faculty, particularly when the subject of interaction is beyond the specific scope of the class.

Historically, OSUIT students have reported lower levels of Support for Learners than the comparison groups for each of the *CCSSE* administrations over the past six years. In 2021, OSUIT students differed from the comparison groups on one item in particular: OSUIT reportedly emphasizes Career Counseling *less* than the comparison



groups ( $p < .01$ ). However, this was the only area where students reported a difference that was statistically significant from the comparison groups (see Appendix E for more complete results).

### Support for Learners



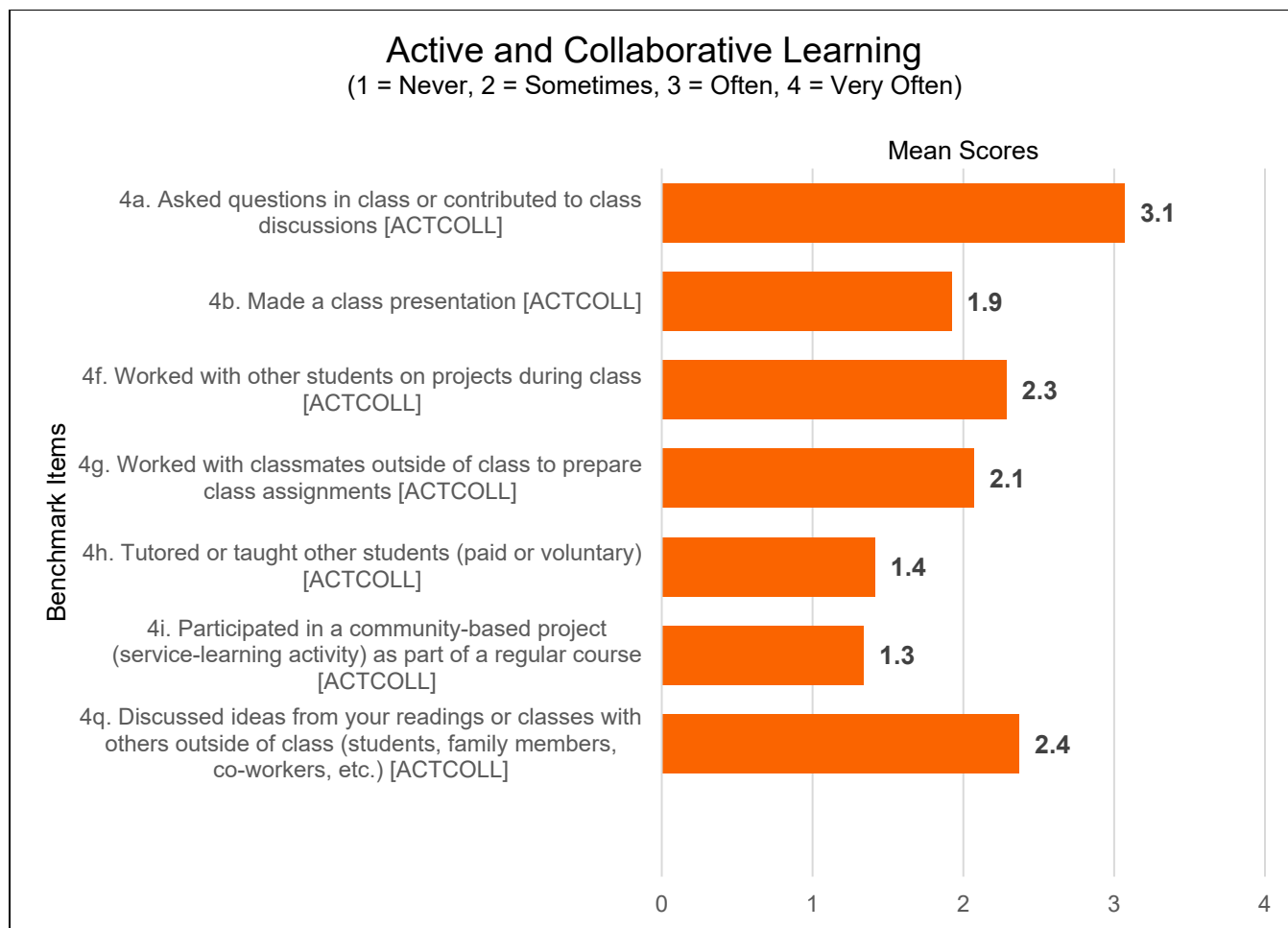

### Active and Collaborative Learning

Students learn more when they are actively involved in their education and have opportunities to think about and apply what they are learning in different settings. Through collaborating with others to solve problems or master challenging content, students develop valuable skills that prepare them to deal with the kinds of situations and problems they will encounter in the workplace, the community, and their personal lives. OSUIT presented as slightly better on this measure than the comparison groups.

Below are the items included in the *Active and Collaborative Learning* benchmark followed by mean scores of OSUIT students for 2021 on each item.

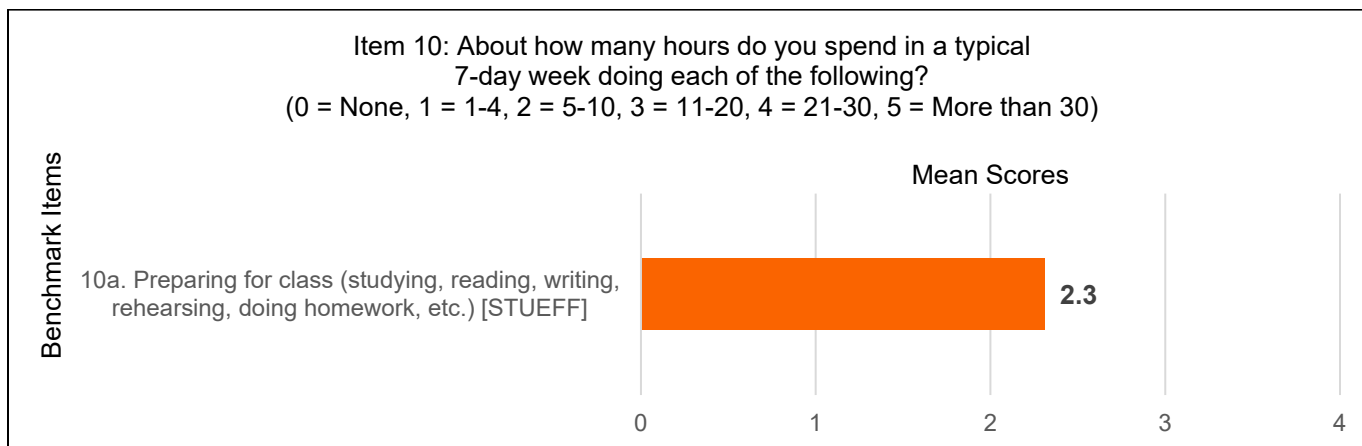
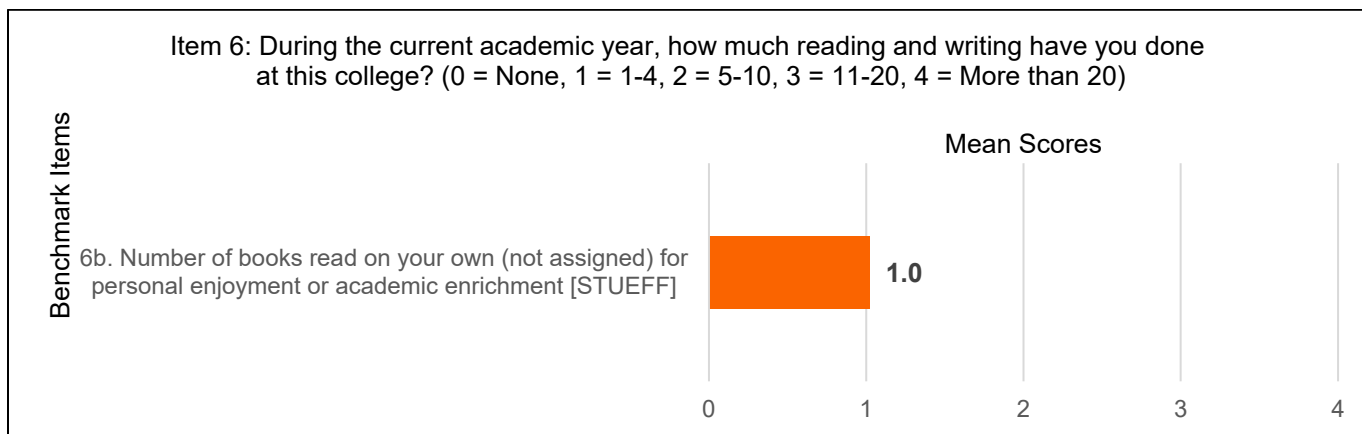
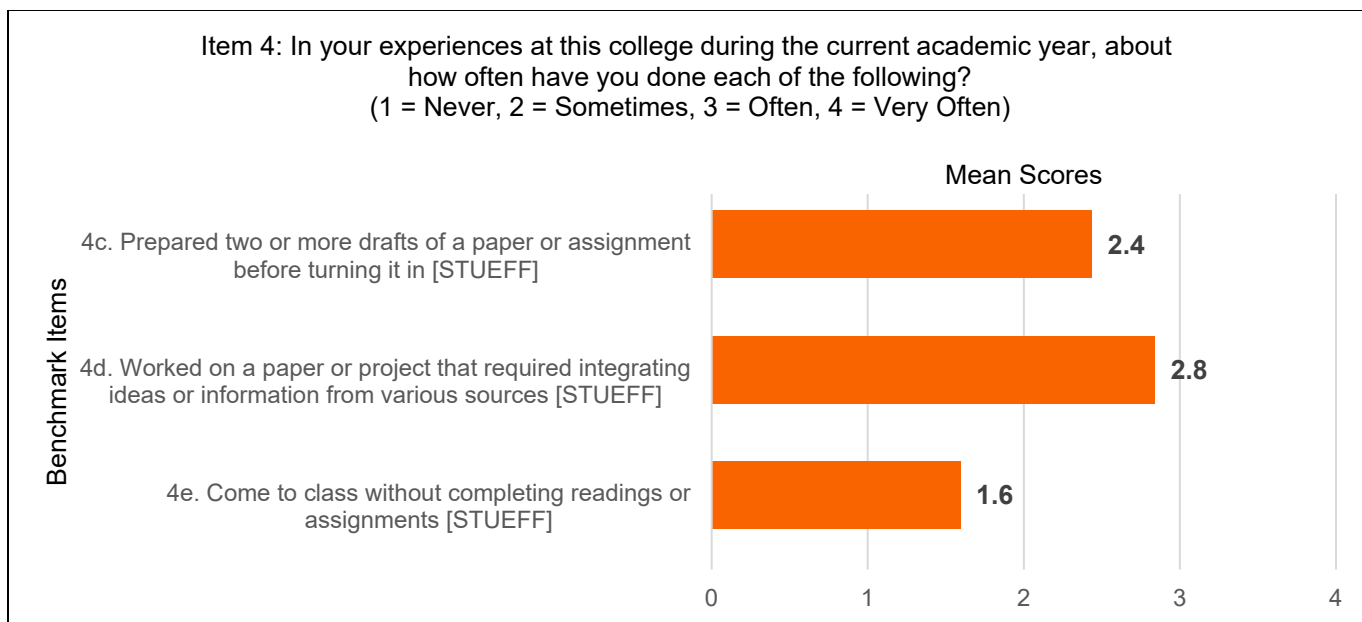

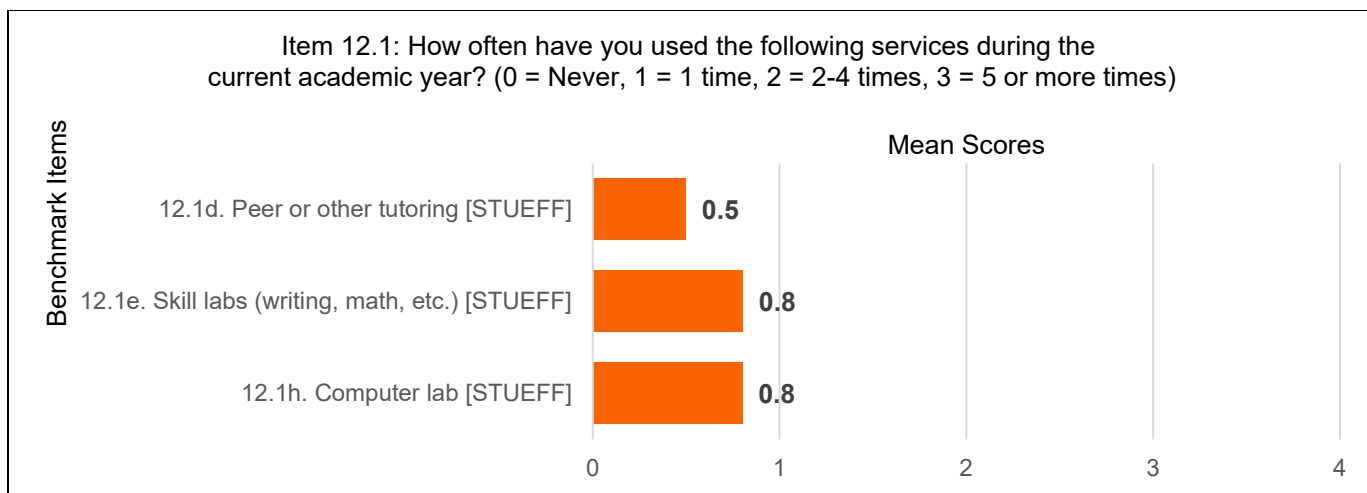


### **Student Effort**

Students’ behaviors contribute significantly to their learning and the likelihood that they will attain their educational goals. “Time on task” is a key variable, and there are a variety of settings and means through which students may apply themselves to the learning process. OSUIT presented as slightly lower on this measure than the comparison groups. Item 12.1 addresses the frequency of students accessing labs (computer & skills) and tutoring services. At OSUIT, tutoring is made available formally through the LASSO Center and the Peer Mentors program. Encouragement by faculty for students to use these tutoring programs may improve engagement which could in turn lead to better retention and higher graduation rates.

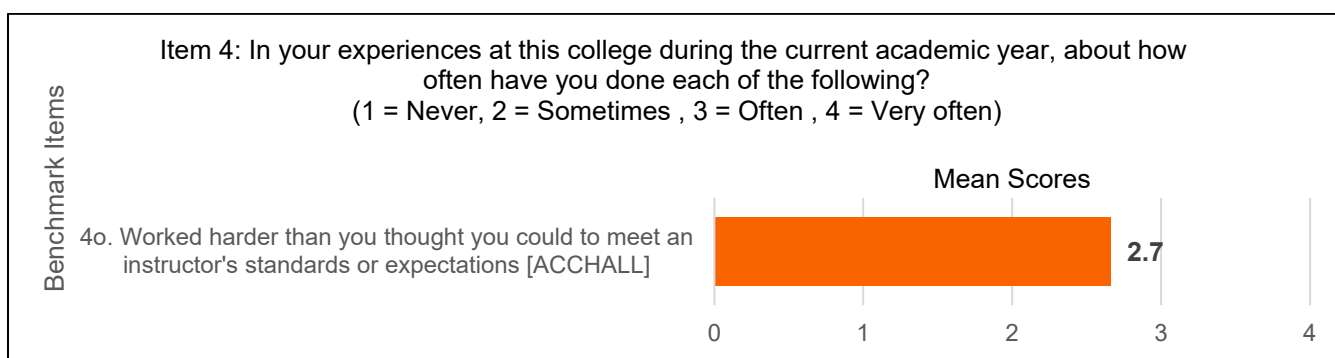


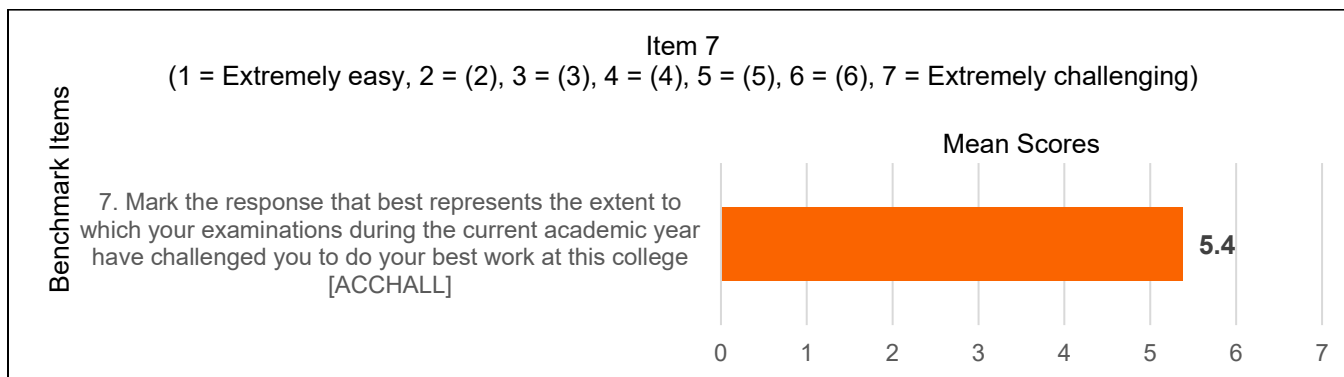
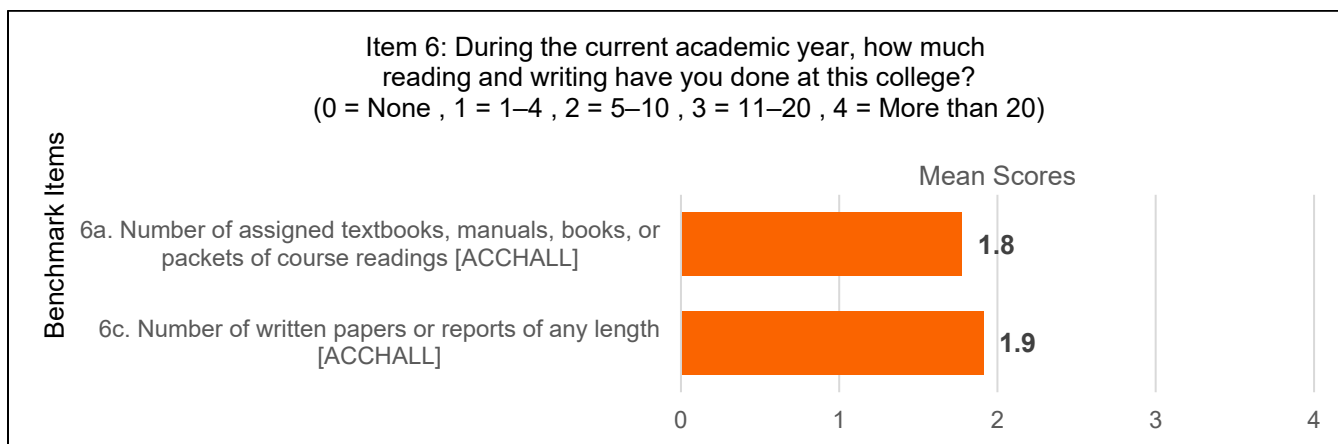
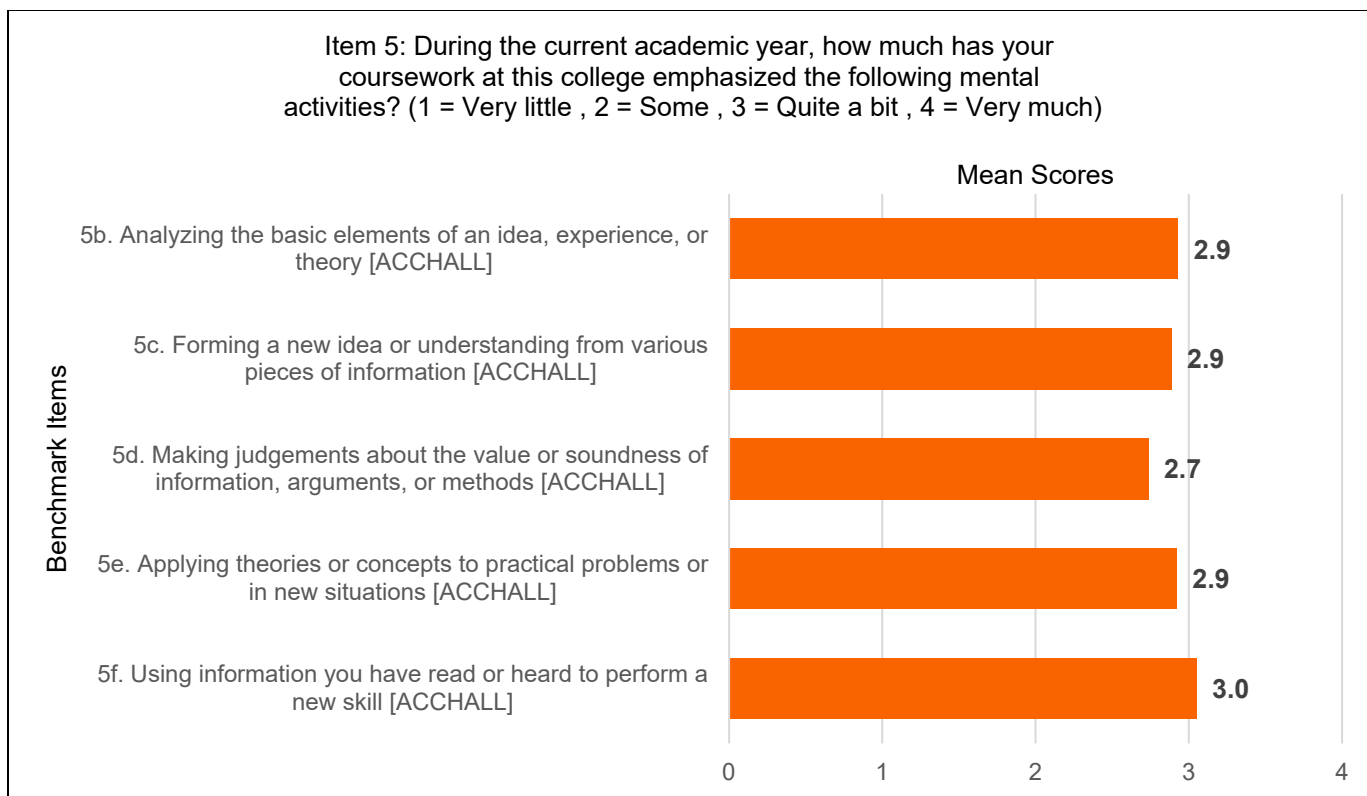


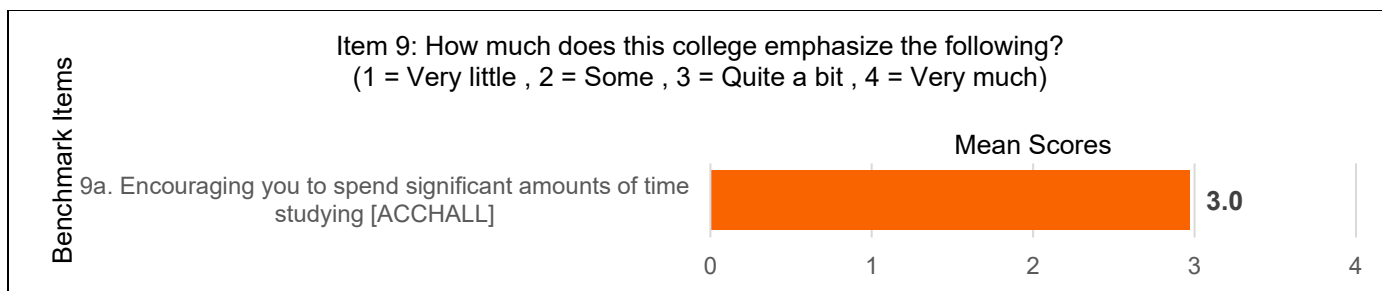
**Academic Challenge**

Challenging intellectual and creative work is central to student learning and collegiate quality. Ten survey items address the nature and amount of assigned academic work, the complexity of cognitive tasks presented to students, and the standards faculty members use to evaluate student performance. OSUIT presented as slightly better on this measure than the comparison groups.

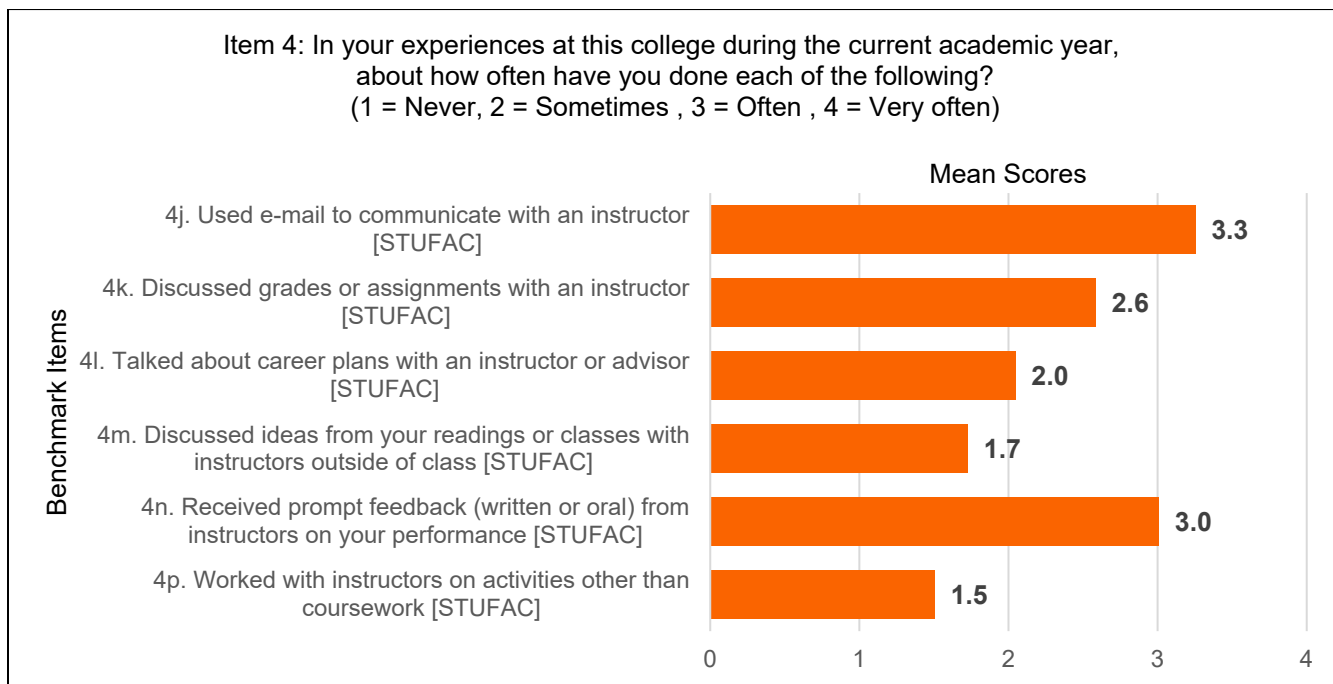




**Student-Faculty Interaction**

In general, the more interaction students have with their teachers, the more likely they are to learn effectively and persist toward achievement of their educational goals. Personal interaction with faculty members strengthens students’ connections to the college and helps them focus on their academic progress. Working with an instructor on a project or serving with faculty members on a college committee lets students see first-hand how experts identify and solve practical problems. Through such interactions, faculty members become role models, mentors, and guides for continuous, lifelong learning. OSUIT presented as slightly better on this measure than the overall cohort but not as well as the comparison group of small colleges.

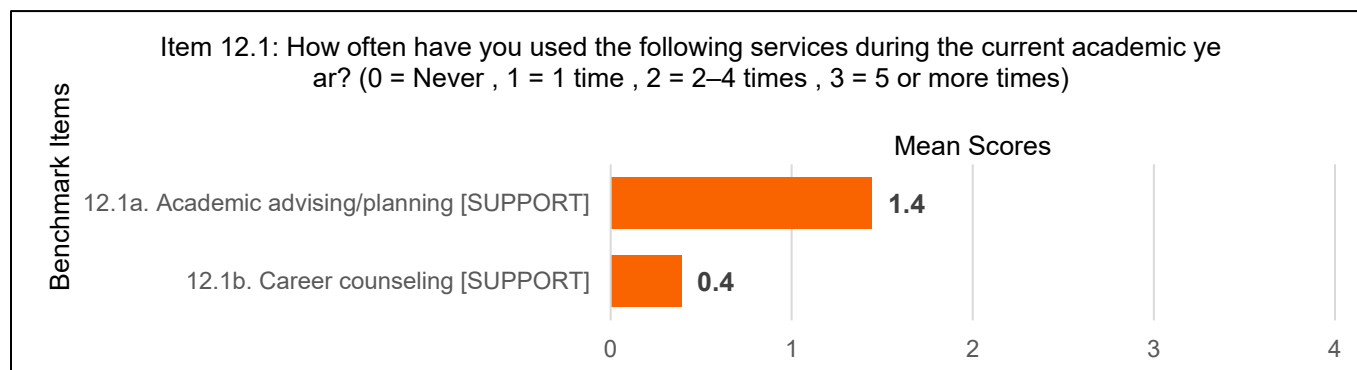
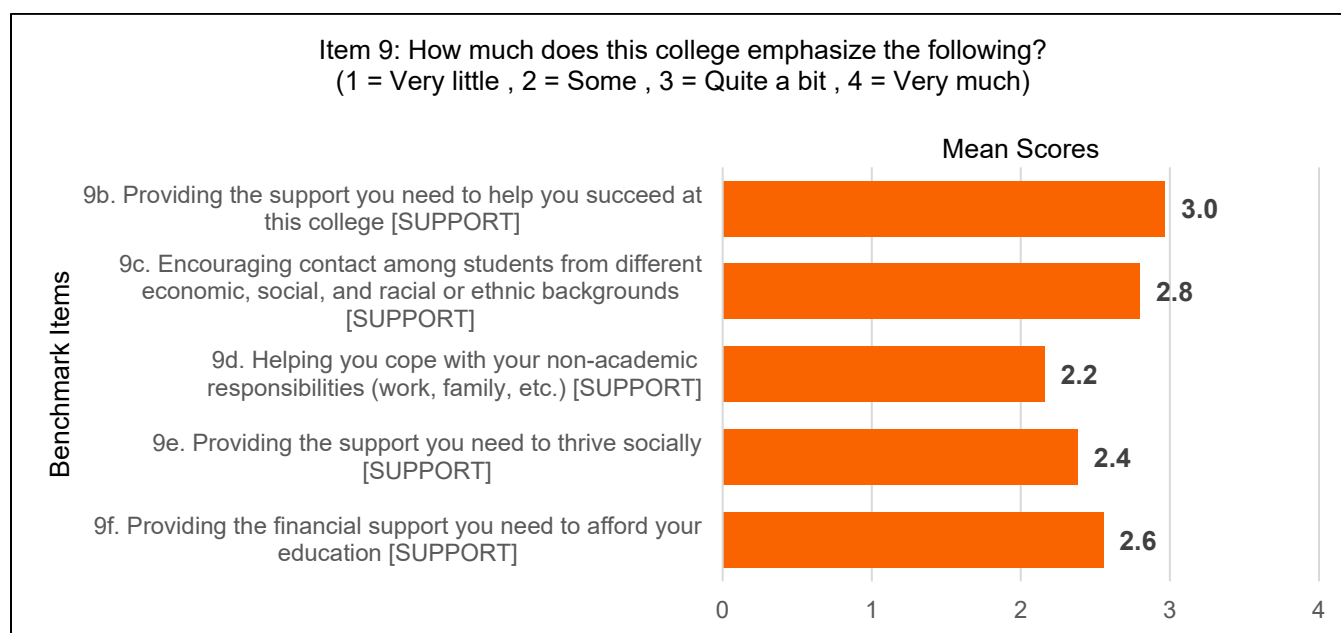


**Support for Learners**

Students perform better and are more satisfied at colleges that are committed to their success and cultivate positive working and social relationships among different groups on campus. Community college students also

benefit from services targeted to assist them with academic and career planning, academic skill development, and other areas that may affect learning and retention. OSUIT presented as somewhat lower on this measure than the comparison groups. However, career counseling is offered by the Assessment Center and Career Services at OSUIT. Students who are encouraged to use this service may show improvement through student engagement, student satisfaction, and may help them with career planning and job placement.

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## **Selected Findings**

In addition to the CCSSE Benchmarks of Effective Educational Practice, other related items were combined into factors providing further areas of interest for analysis; several of these areas of interest are included below with highlights as reported by OSUIT students.

### **Academic and Curricular Experiences**

When asked about skipping classes, 85.2% of OSUIT students reported *never* skipping class as compared to 68.1% from the Small Colleges comparison group and 68.5% from the 2021 Cohort. OSUIT students also reported higher levels of prompt feedback from instructors; improvement in this area is welcome news. In addition, OSUIT students report higher levels of the following:

- Asking questions or contributing to class discussions
- Working with classmates outside of class to prepare class assignments
- Participating in a first-year experience program

### **Career Development and Counseling**

OSUIT students report talking less often about career plans with an instructor or advisor than do students from the comparison groups. On the other hand, OSUIT students are more likely to have internships, field experiences, co-op experiences, or clinical assignments than students in the Small Colleges or 2021 Cohort comparison groups.

### **Financial Assistance**

More than the comparison groups, OSUIT students are more likely to receive employer contributions and military/veterans benefits to help pay for college. However, OSUIT students are more likely than students in the comparison groups to take out student loans as a major source of funding to help them afford college.

### **Job Skills/Job Placement**

OSUIT students, more than the comparison groups, recognize how this school has contributed to their knowledge, skills, and personal development. Although less likely to seek career counseling services, they chose OSUIT to accomplish their goals to acquire or update job- or work-related knowledge and skills.

### **Peer-to-Peer Interactions In/Out of Class**

OSUIT students are more likely than the comparison groups to:

- Ask questions in class or contribute to class discussions
- Work with classmates outside of class to prepare class assignments
- Discuss ideas from readings/classes with others outside of class

### **Support Services and Student-Staff Interaction**

When compared to the other groups, OSUIT students report receiving some financial support, but still having difficulty being able to afford their education. Also, as opposed to the comparison groups, OSUIT students do not as often:

- Seek academic advising/planning
- Seek transfer advising/planning
- Seek academic career counseling
- Use the computer labs or library services



For those OSUIT students who do utilize the available services, these are generally more satisfied with the services than students in the comparison groups.

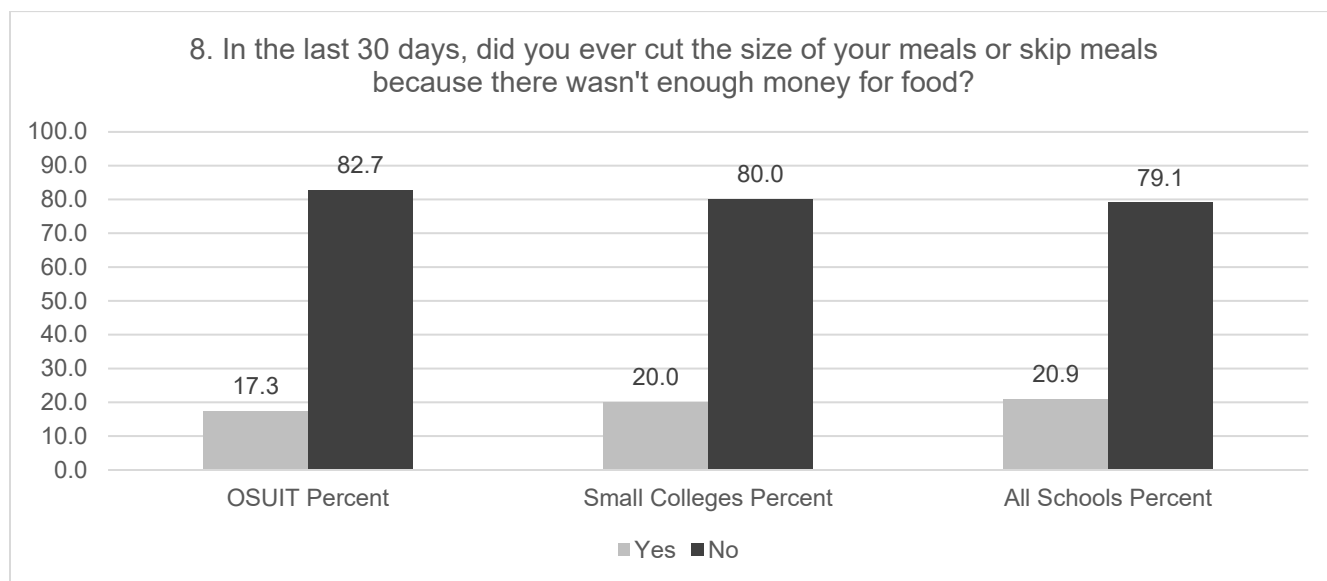
**Withdrawing**

Compared to the Small Colleges and 2021 Cohort groups, OSUIT has a higher percentage of students who:

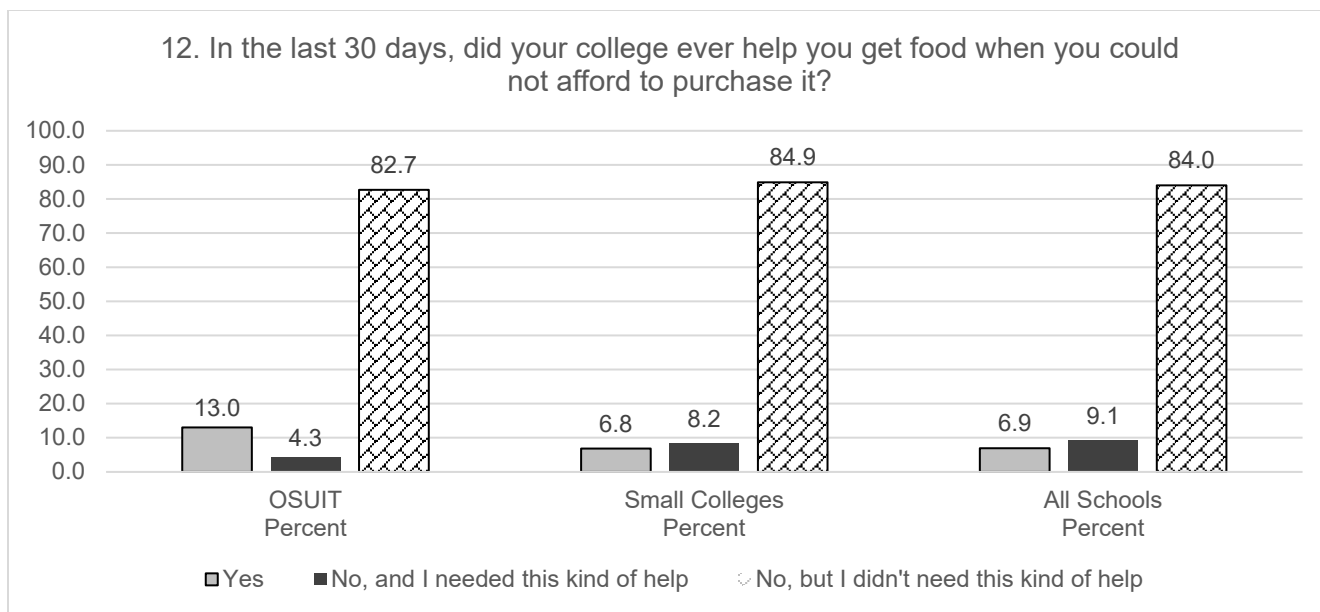
- Work full-time jobs than students in the comparison groups
- Care for dependents more than 30 hours per week
- Live on or near campus
- Are less likely to seek transfer to a four-year institution

**2021 CCSSE Special-Focus Items: Students in Need**

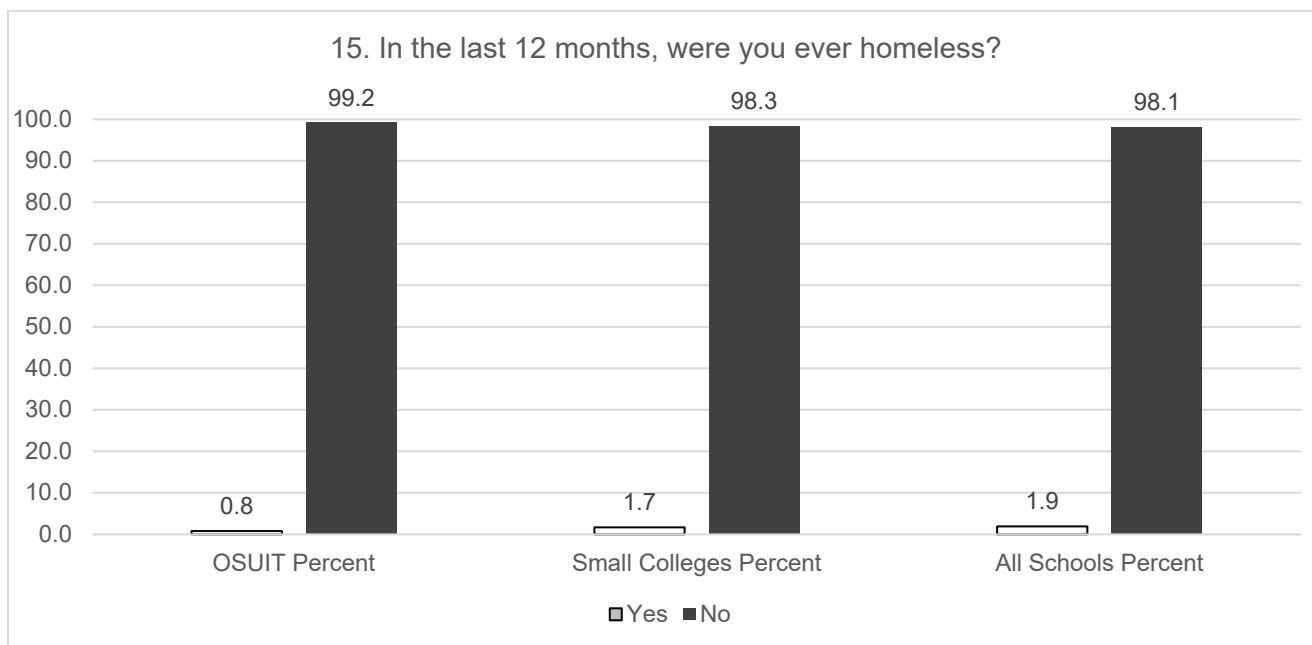
The Center adds special-focus items to CCSSE each year to augment the core survey, helping participating colleges and the field at large to further explore fundamental areas of student engagement. The 2021 special-focus items elicit new information around the topic of student need, such as whether students can afford basic necessities such as food, shelter, and utilities; and whether they feel like the school has provided any support to help meet these needs. The graphs below show how students at OSUIT compare to other small colleges and to the members of the 2021 Cohort who participated in this “Students in Need” portion of the survey. The tables containing the results of all the Students in Need survey items are found in Appendix F.

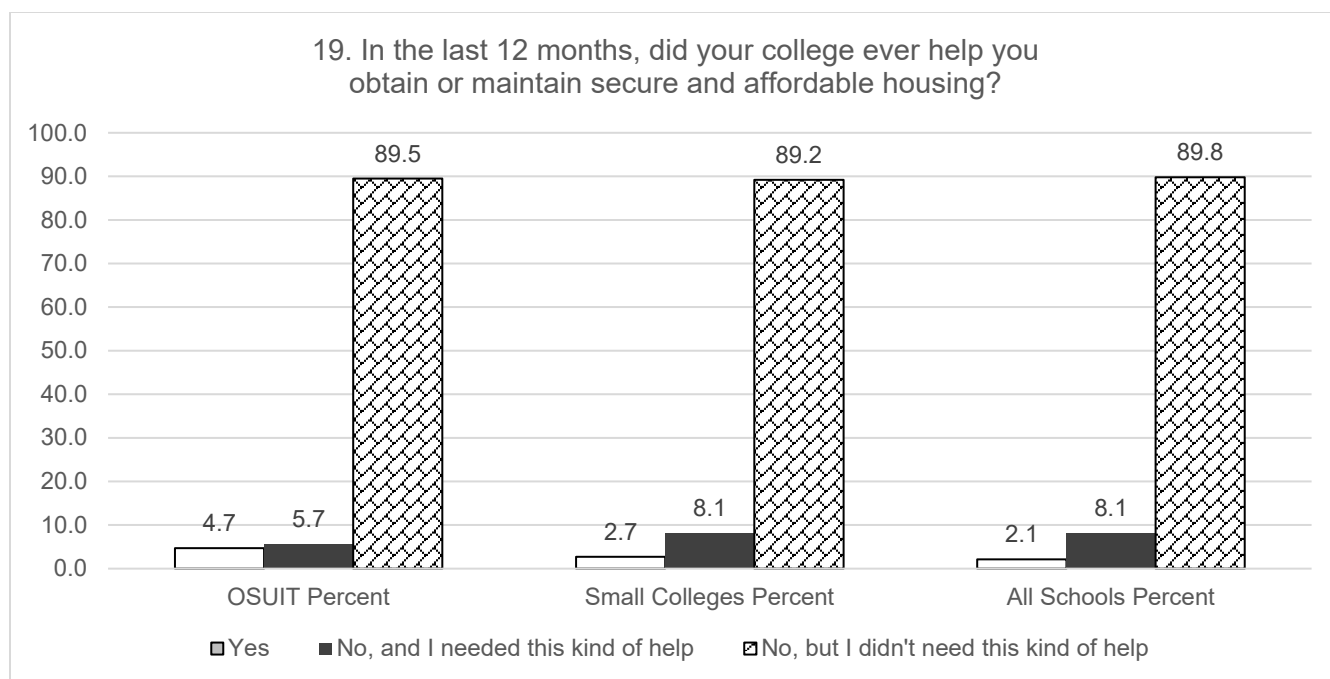


From the graph above, we see that OSUIT students were less likely to suffer from food insecurity than those in the comparison groups which may have been impacted favorably by the availability of food through Pete’s Pantry. However, there are still some OSUIT students having to deal with this issue.



As shown above, OSUIT does provide for some of the students' needs in overcoming food insecurity. The following graphs show that OSUIT students were less likely to struggle with homelessness; but several of those who did were able to receive some support from OSUIT to acquire affordable housing. The numbers appear small in the graph, but they still represent students with real needs.





## **Conclusions**

OSUIT exceeded three of the five benchmarks for 2021: Active and Collaborative Learning, Academic Challenge, and Student-Faculty Interaction. OSUIT fell just short of the Student Effort and Support for Learners benchmarks.

Strengths identified by OSUIT students include:

- Working with classmates outside of class to prepare class assignments
- Asking questions in class or contributing to class discussions
- Preparing for class (studying, reading, writing, rehearsing, doing homework, etc.)
- Exams are more challenging
- Number of papers or reports written
- Attendance in skills labs (writing, math, etc.)
- Received prompt feedback (written or oral) from instructors
- Contact among students from different economic, social, and racial or ethnic backgrounds was encouraged

Areas of focus for improvement in the Student Effort category include:

- Coming to class having completed readings or assignments
- Using peer or other tutoring more often
- Using the computer lab more often

Areas of focus for improvement in the Support for Learners category include more emphasis on:

- Career counseling
- Academic advising/planning
- Providing the support (students) need to help (students) succeed at this college
- Providing the financial support (students) need to afford (their) education
